Context (comparison against South Lanarkshire)

In terms of Community Safety, the area has:-

- Significantly more Accidental Dwelling fires
- Significantly more Admission rate per 100,000 due to unintentional injuries
- Significantly more Road accident casualties total
- Significantly more Crimes of violence (rate per 10,000)
- Significantly more anti social behaviour reported incidents
